JOIN Annual General Meeting In Brussels Belgium, 21st May 2023

What we did in 2022

- 477,000 hours of event first aid cover
- 25,528 workplace training courses and 236,921 people trained
- 229,875 hours of emergency ambulance crew
- 75,712 hours of **supporting** the NHS
- 40 tonnes of **equipment** distributed to support the Late Majesty's funeral
- 29,847 people educated in **communities** to save lives
- 1,355 patients in our homeless service
- 44,385 **volunteers** including 9,826 young people

Our activities included

- Delivered Covid-19 vaccinations
- With partners, supported the emergency response in Ukraine
- 1,000 volunteers supported the Platinum Jubilee celebrations
- Celebrated 100 years of St John Ambulance cadets
- 2,000 volunteers supported mourners during the period of mourning
- Achieved across the board ratings as 'Good' by our regulator

St John won the NHS Ambulance Auxiliary and opened new Hubs to support

- In the Summer 2022 St John won a contract to be the official Auxiliary of the NHS Ambulance service
- We will continue to support NHS services with treating and transporting patients and provide at least 5000 hours of support a month to 10 trusts across the UK
- New hubs opened to build our patient transport services in the Midlands including neonatal and paediatric care

Supporting the Queen's Funeral

- Over 2800 St John Volunteers signed up to support during the 12-day mourning period for Queen Elizabeth II
- Providing 24 hour care across the whole city our volunteers gave their everything

Our Youth

- Our Cadet of the Year competition saw 36 cadets competing for both regional and national COTY
- They completed First Aid assessments, presentations, and group discussions over a weekend competition, 8 regional and one national were chosen
- Cadets were taken on Night Time Economy for the first time
- We were awarded £2.4 million by the Government to support opening new youth units in harder to reach communities

Coronation and the Marathon- a busy Spring

• Over the **London Marathon** we deployed 1000 volunteers, 42 treatment centres, 52 ambulances, 14 Cycle Response Unit teams and 150 cadets – with over 50,000 runners



• **Coronation** saw us send 300 Volunteers, 60 HCPs, 21 Pop up treatment centres and other teams across London and Windsor
